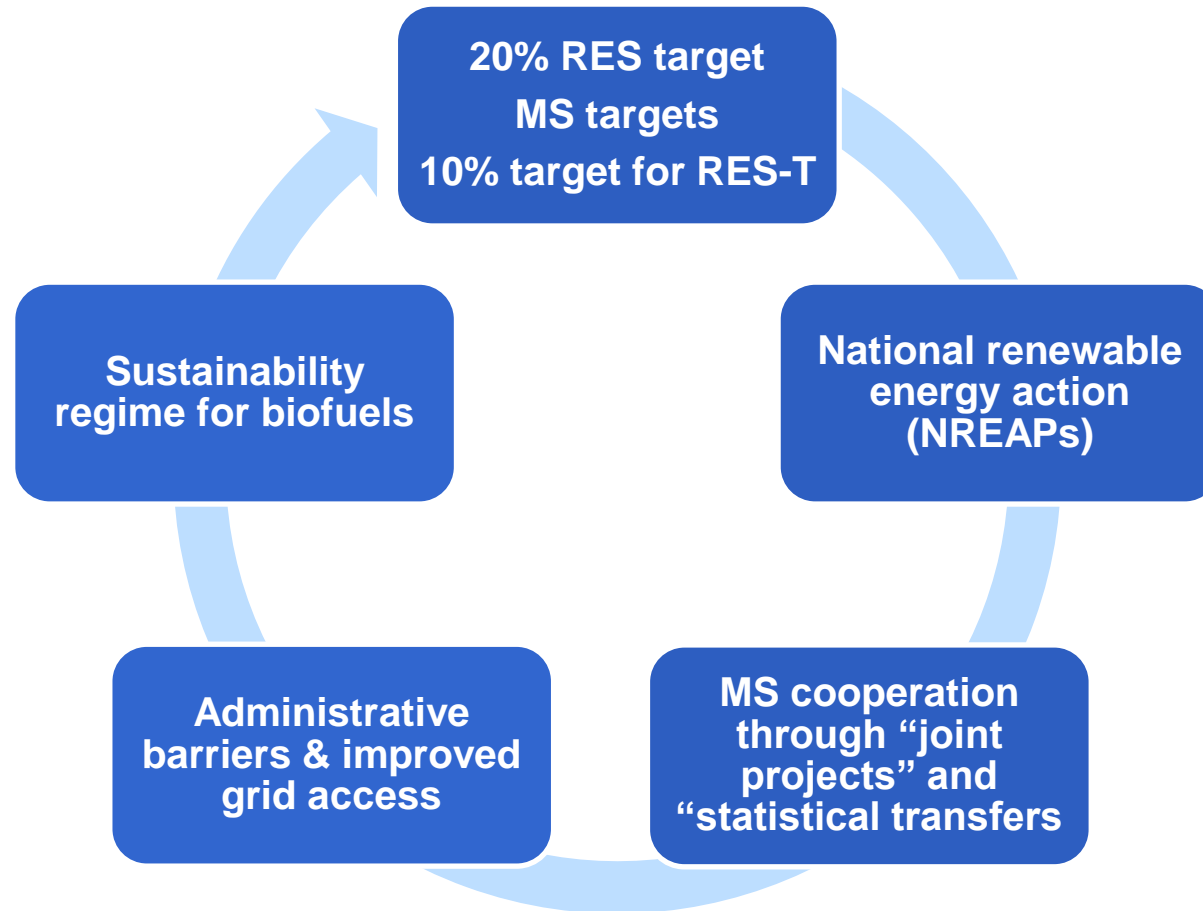




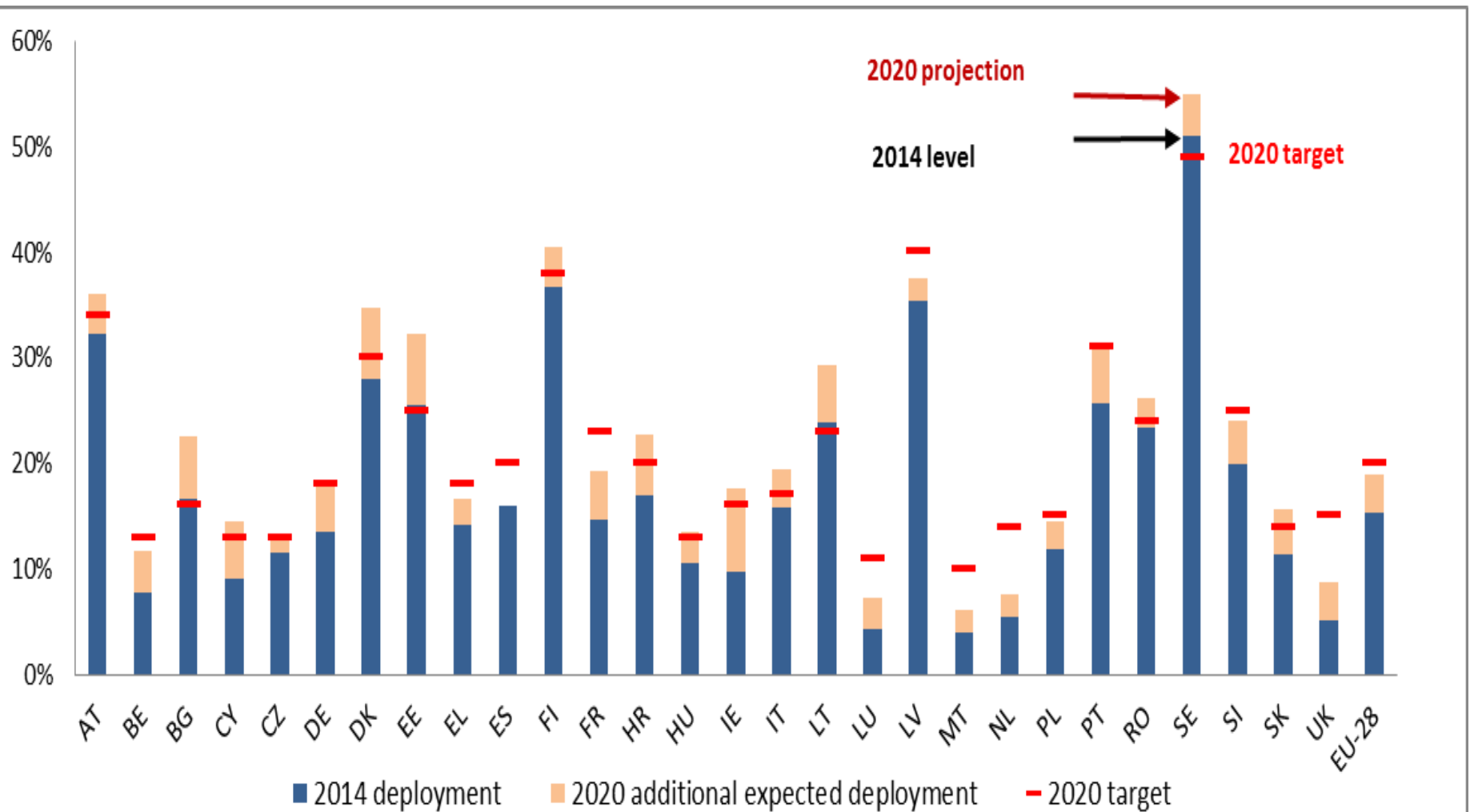
Europe's renewable energy framework

The 2009 Renewable Energy Directive



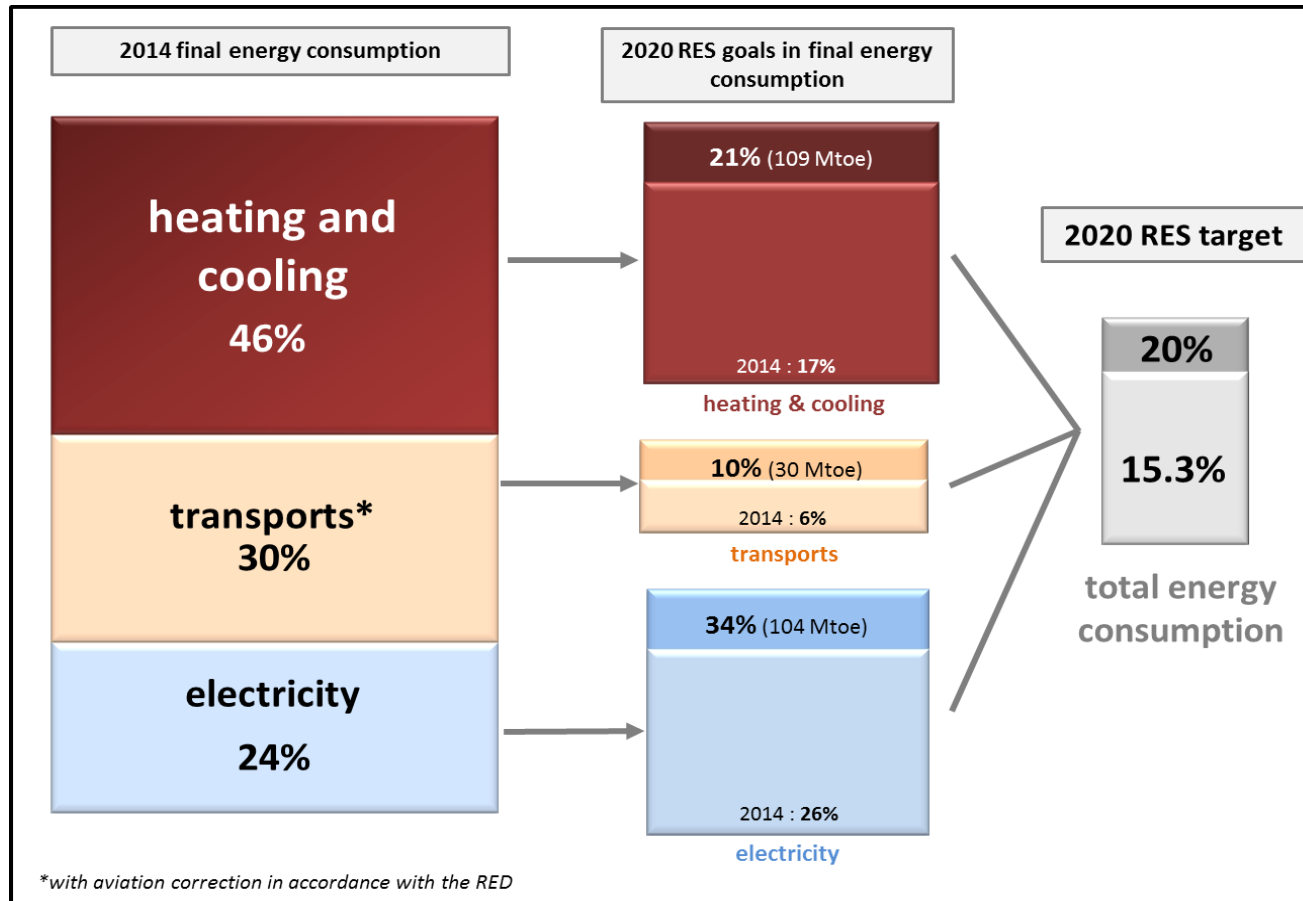


National RES deployment (2014 and 2020 projections)

In 2012, renewables reduced CO₂ emissions by 326 Mt: equivalent to the annual emissions of Spain

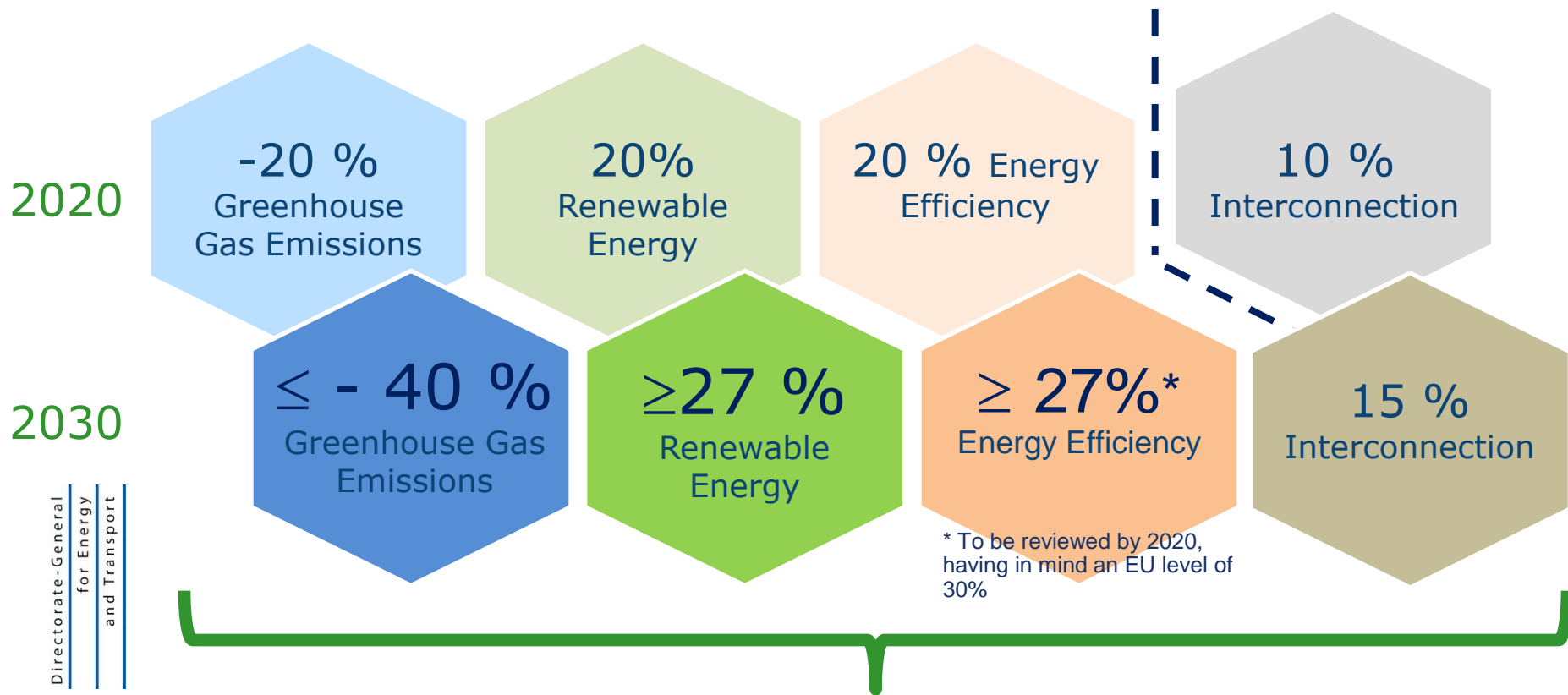

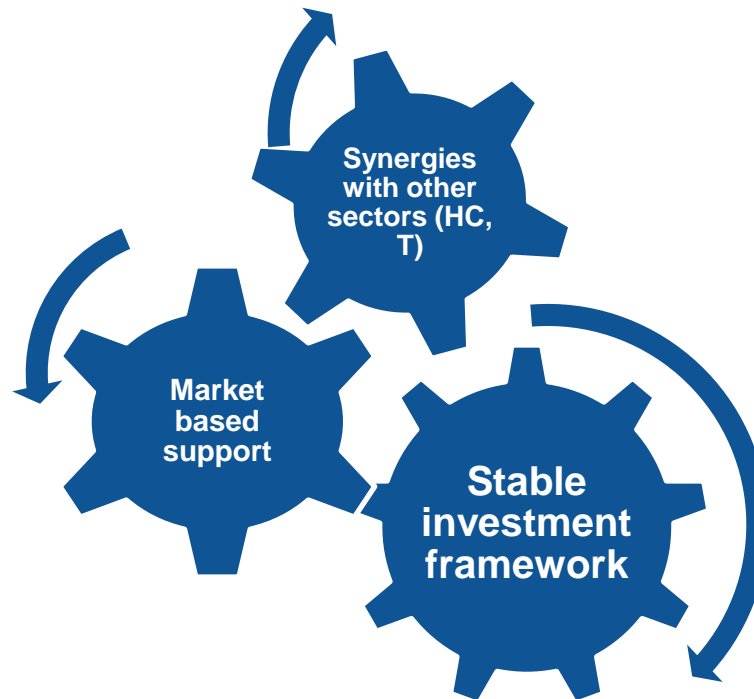
2030 Framework for Climate and Energy
